### **Business Owner Detained for Failure to Comply with Bond Conditions Detailing Steps Necessary to Extinguish Property Fire**

*City of South Fulton continues to work with partnering agencies to mitigate the fire*

(CITY OF SOUTH FULTON, GEORGIA, Thursday, December 6, 2018 -) The City of South Fulton has moved forward with additional legal proceedings to compel Tandy R. Bullock, the owner of Bullock Construction, to put out a long-burning fire on his property located at 7635 Bishop Road.

Bullock was detained today in the City Municipal Court for failing to comply with bond conditions requiring that he take necessary actions, as recommended by the Environmental Protection Division (EPD) to address this urgent situation. These actions include commencing work immediately with qualified professionals to extinguish the fire and mitigate any potential erosion impacts to neighboring properties.

“It is important that we as City protect the quality of life in our community, especially as it has to do with issues pertaining to the environment. Our goal in this matter is to enforce strict compliance and restore the property involved back to its useful purpose,” said Mayor William “Bill” Edwards.

The City is working diligently to resolve the outstanding violations and safety concerns on Bullock’s property. Bullock’s next court date in this case is Wednesday, December 12, 2018. The court is located at 5060 Union Street, Union City, GA 30291.

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
