



City of South Fulton Closed to the Public

The City of South Fulton will discontinue all in-person services and programs indefinitely as we seek to prevent the spread of Coronavirus Disease 2019 – COVID-19. This will start tomorrow, Monday, March 16, 2020. Specifically, these include all City events, parks and recreation events and programs and similar functions. All City facilities, including City Hall, will remain closed to the public until further notice.

Essential employees, including fire and police personnel, will report to work as scheduled. Sanitation services will continue as will any code enforcement activity. The City has instituted a telecommute policy for all other employees.

The City of South Fulton City Council will meet Tuesday, March 17, 2020 at 5 p.m. for a work session and at 7 p.m. for the regular council meeting. Both meetings will be closed to the public but will be available via livestream on YouTube.
