Quarantined and Cluttered? Clean up with the City of South Fulton

(City of South Fulton, GA – July 6, 2020) Feeling cluttered during quarantine? Now is the time to clean and clear your house of things you do not need, and the City of South Fulton is ready to help.

The city is giving residents an opportunity to throw away bulk items and trash at its summer cleanup day on Saturday, July 18, from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. at two collection sites.

“Our summer clean up event will allow residents to get rid of items they have stored in their garages or attics that are just taking up space,” said Mayor William “Bill” Edwards. “We are committed to preventing illegal dumping and want our residents to know they can dispose of things they do not want in a safe way that does not create an environmental concern or an eyesore.”

The two collection sites are Merk Miles Transfer Station at 3325 Merk Road and Creel Park located at 2775 Creel Road in South Fulton. Document shredding, yard debris and cleaning supplies are only allowed for disposal at Merk Miles Transfer Station. To view a list of approved items, visit

Curbside trash pickup is available for senior citizens 65 years or older and individuals with disabilities who are residents of the City of South Fulton. The city’s public works professionals will pick up trash and bulky items for all seniors on Friday, July 17. Call (470)-552-4311 to register for this service by Wednesday, July 15.

The City of South Fulton recently began an effort to stop illegal dumping and has partnered with neighboring cities on cleanup projects. Edwards and Mayor Elizabeth Carr-Hurst of Fairburn came together at the end of June to clear an illegal dumping site along Irwin Road. The half-mile road, located in both cities, was littered with a variety of debris, including tires, mattresses, toilets, furniture, car parts, household trash, yard waste and other items.
