

Redistricting Facts for Fulton County Voters

Thousands of Fulton County Voters were affected by redistricting this year. Voters are encouraged to review their current district information on the Georgia My Voter Page. For questions please call 404-612-3816.

Why is redistricting conducted?

The purpose of redistricting is to ensure that populations of districts are equitable. This is sometimes referred to as “one person, one vote.”

Who sets district boundaries?

- District boundaries are set by the Georgia General Assembly.

When is redistricting conducted?

- Redistricting takes place after the completion of every Census (every 10 years). Redistricting changes that were adopted by the General Assembly in a 2021 Special Session and the 2022 Session will take effect for the purposes of the 2022 Primary Election and General Election. District boundaries will change in 2023.

What offices are affected by redistricting?

- For 2022, redistricting changes affect district boundaries for U.S. Congress, Georgia General Assembly (House and Senate), Fulton County Commissioners, and Fulton County Board of Education.



How do I find my districts?

To see what district boundaries you are assigned to, enter your information into the Georgia My Voter Page at mvp.sos.ga.gov.
